#### IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM OWNERS

Cayman Islands is one of the safest islands in the world, but if the opportunity exists, you will always have individuals who take advantage of unsuspecting guests. The condo has an alarm system, we have installed security pins for all the patio doors and we have a dead bolt on the front door. We can provide an alarm code upon request, but we strongly urge you to ensure that the patio door pins and dead bolt are engaged when out of the unit or during the night. Any reported instances of trouble in other units have found that both of these extra devices were not engaged. On a positive note, we have been going to Cayman since mid 90's, and visit many times a year, and have never had any issues, but we have always practiced what we have noted above.*
